MINISTRY OF LABOUR, TRAINING AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT CONSULTATION NOTICE

Updating reference to Engineers in Regulations under the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* (OHSA)

On December 2, 2021 the <u>Bill 13, Supporting People and Businesses Act, 2021</u> amended the <u>Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA)</u> to introduce a new definition for 'engineer' that will take effect upon a date to be proclaimed. The new definition provides:

"engineer" means, subject to any prescribed requirements or restrictions, a person who is licensed as a professional engineer or who holds a limited licence under the Professional Engineers Act;

The Ministry is proposing to update all references to "professional engineer" in the regulations made under OHSA and replace them with 'engineer' to reflect the new definition. The updates can be made subject to any prescribed requirements or restrictions. Amending the references in the regulations would authorize "engineers", as defined, to provide certain reports, advice and certification required under those regulations.

Currently, the following regulations under the OHSA make reference to a 'professional engineer':

- Regulation 859 Window Cleaning
- <u>Regulation 856 Roll-Over Protective Structures</u>
- Regulation 855 Oil and Gas Offshore
- Regulation 854 Mines and Mining Plants
- <u>Regulation 851 Industrial Establishments</u>

NOTICE TO CONSULTATION PARTICIPANTS

Submissions and comments provided to the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development (the Ministry) are part of a public consultation process to solicit views on the proposal to update reference to Engineers in Regulations under the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA). An individual who provides a submission or comments and indicates a professional affiliation with an organization will be considered a representative of that organization and his or her identity in their professional capacity as the organization's representative may be disclosed.
