

Proposed Amendments to Regulation 720 (Manufacturers' Licences) under the *Liquor Licence Act*

1. Prohibition

- It is an offence for a liquor manufacturer, agent or employee of the manufacturer to pay, pay any commission, profit, remuneration or make a gift to a board member or employee of the AGCO (Subsection 2(2)).
- It is proposed that the prohibition on gifts be extended to members and employees of the Licence Appeal Tribunal. This change is consistent with the transfer of adjudicative responsibilities from the AGCO Board to the Licence Appeal Tribunal.

2. Notification by an Ontario Wine Manufacturer

- A manufacturer of Ontario wine may give liquor to a person in an outdoor place where the public is not ordinarily invited or permitted access if the manufacturer has notified the AGCO Board (Subsection 3(5)(c)).
- It is proposed that this notification be made to the Registrar of Alcohol and Gaming. This change is consistent with the transfer of adjudicative responsibilities from the AGCO Board to the Licence Appeal Tribunal.
